What is a Visual Story?

A Visual Story provides simple information with images to help explain what an event will be like.

It is designed so people can know what to expect, plan ahead with confidence, and feel comfortable taking part in the event.

Welcome

The Mandurah Christmas Pageant will be held on Friday, 28 November 2025, from 6pm to 9pm.

The Pageant runs along Mandurah Terrace through the City Centre.



Getting there

Some roads will be closed for the Pageant.

Parking is available across the City Centre, including Hackett Street, Leslie Street, Gibson Street, and Sholl Street.

Extra ACROD bays will be provided in the car park near the Mandurah Visitor Centre.



Watching the Pageant

The Pageant is a popular community event, and many people will attend.

The busiest areas will be Smart Street Mall and Mandurah Terrace.

A quieter area to watch might be possible on Tuckey Street, between Mandurah Terrace and Sholl Street.



What to expect

The Pageant will include colourful floats, community groups, lively performers, music, and drums, creating a vibrant atmosphere along the route.

People are asked to stay safe by keeping a comfortable distance from the vehicles as they pass.



Sounds and atmosphere

The event will include music, drums, cheering, and clapping. The atmosphere is lively and festive.

People who find sound overwhelming may choose to bring earplugs or earmuffs.



Santa

A highlight of the Pageant will be a special appearance by Santa.

To add to the festive spirit, there may also be sweets handed out to the crowd during the evening.




Visit Santa

After Santa finishes in the Pageant, he will make his way to a special tent on the Eastern Foreshore.

Families who would like to can line up to see him.

Please note there may be a wait, as this is a popular activity.



After the Pageant

The Pageant lasts for about one hour.

Afterwards, there will be free activities for people of all ages along the Eastern Foreshore.

Activities will include roving performers and an outdoor movie screen.



Food and refreshments

Food trucks will be serving a variety of meals and drinks which can be purchased.

The smell of food cooking and the lively sounds around the stalls will be part of the experience on the night.



Christmas Lights Trail

The Christmas Lights Trail also begins on the night of the Pageant.

People can choose to see some of the displays after the event or return another evening to enjoy the lights at their own pace.

There is also a Visual Story available for the Christmas Lights Trail.



Toilet facilities

Toilets are available near the Mandurah Visitor Centre and on the Eastern Foreshore.

These include standard and accessible toilets, and a Changing Places facility with an adult change table, ceiling hoist, shower, and accessible toilet.

A personal MLAK key is needed to access the Changing Places facility.
