

Incident report record

Use this table to keep a record of who was called, the date and time, and what the reason was.

Who did you call? (include names, numbers called, websites used)
Time and date of call
Why did you call? (actions witnessed/sequence of events)
Time and date of incident
Other important notes? Location, description of the people involved (identifying features, clothing) vehicle including license plate/make of vehicle.

Responding to anti-social behaviour in our community





What is anti-social behaviour?

Anti-social behaviour includes any aggressive, intimidating or disruptive actions that harm someone's quality of life, such as:

- Violence or threats of violence.
- Harassment or intimidation.
- Substance-related activity.
- Excessive noise during odd hours, graffiti, illegal dumping or nuisance from animals.
- Large groups of people causing harassment of individuals.
- Hooning.

We encourage everyone to work together to create a safe and supportive community.



How to respond to anti-social behaviour

Call Police:

- For criminal offences or incidents requiring police attendance call 131 444.
- To provide anonymous information call Crimestoppers on 1800 333 000.
- Where there is immediate threat to people or property or if a serious crime is occurring call 000.
- Keep your own records of incidents including report numbers (refer to form on back page).

Steps to Take:

1. Remain calm. Prioritise your own safety first.
2. If the behaviour persists, call Police on 131 444 (save and provide any CCTV or video evidence if available).
3. Request and record any report numbers.
4. Do not engage further - avoiding interaction can prevent escalation.
