An exploration of the enduring connection between Koort (heart), Boodja (Country), and the ancestral memory carried through generations of the Bibbulmun people. It is a deeply personal and cultural reflection on identity, truth-telling, and the survival of our spirit, despite the ongoing impacts of colonisation. Through storytelling and symbolism, the artworks investigate how land, family, and language form the core of who we are, not only as individuals but as a collective people with unbroken ties to place.

Applications for the 2027 CASM exhibition program are open from **January 2026 to April 2026**.

Additionally, CASM also programs an annual group conceptual exhibition, inviting artists to create and submit one artwork that responds to a specific theme.

CASM STUDIO RESIDENCY PROGRAM

CASM's regular residency program is offered to support emerging contemporary artists investigating a new body of work in a vibrant, active space with support from the creative community and CASM staff.

CREATIVE EXTENSION RESIDENCY PROGRAM

The Creative Extension Residency program supports artists developing their practice through provision of space, mentorship, professional development and materials.

Three opportunities have been extended to the creative community to apply for:

Emerge – a three-month residency specifically targeted at young artists, aged 18 - 25 years old, with the intention to offer dedicated time to develop personal artistic practice in their home community.

Connect – a three-month residency designed to encourage artists to expand their artistic practice beyond their personal development and to engage with the community context in which they work and create.

Evolve – a six-month residency for individual artists or artist groups to develop a specific body of work with guidance, mentorship and a dedicated space. This body of work must be developed to debut as a solo CASM exhibition in the year following the residency.
