What is a Social Story™?

A Social Story™ uses storytelling to explain new experiences and environments, helpful for people feeling nervous about attending a new place or event.

- Read the social story two weeks before the visit.
- If reading to someone, help them understand key points.
- After the visit, re-read the social story to celebrate achievements.



I am going to the Mr Snot-Bottom Stinky Silly Show.

If I come early to the show, I may want to join the "Foyer Fun" with different activities, it takes place from 9-11am.

There will be a Ukulele workshop. People will play music and have fun. That is okay.





There will be a little market in the Mandurah Performing Arts Centre.

Young people will sell their handcrafted items. I may choose to buy some.





The Fishtrap Theatre will have a stage and rows of chairs for people to sit in.

A volunteer might help direct me to my seat.





The Mr. Snot-Bottom Stinky Silly Show will have a performer on a stage.

There will be music, and the lights might be dim.

Other people in the audience might cheer and laugh during the show because they are having fun. This is okay.

I will sit in a chair in the audience.



If it gets too noisy, I may choose to wear noise reduction earmuffs.

I can wear my own, or I can go to the Chill Out Zone and use some there.
