



Connectivity

There are a number of ways to get around town in Mandurah. Our City offers various transport options whilst maintaining the charm of a regional city.

RAIL & BUS SERVICES

An even faster way to get to Mandurah is TransPerth's public train service, operating between Perth and Mandurah at a travel time of just under an hour. Public buses operate from the train station to the city centre.

CAR & TRANSFER SERVICES

Mandurah is less than an hour drive from Perth and can be accessed most directly via the Kwinana Freeway, exiting at Mandjoogoordap Drive. From there, the route is well sign-posted to get you to the city centre.

You can book a bus tour, vehicle charter, or use the public bus service within Mandurah to get to where you need to be. Taxis and hire cars are also readily available within the city centre.

Discover

Mandurah has a broad range of things to do all year round. As a coastal destination, it is spectacular in spring and summer and the mild winters provide the perfect backdrop to showcase the natural beauty and landscapes of the region.

ADVENTURE & ACTIVITY

Mandurah is home to a diverse range of landscapes offering a place for thrill seekers to engage in anything from zip wires to ocean jet skiing. For those seeking a calmer adventure the expansive waterways provide the perfect place for a leisurely kayak, canoe or some fishing and crabbing fun.







Mandjar Square

Mandjar Square is a funky compact space with just over 2,500 square metres of area overlooking Mandurah's spectacular waterways.

Mandurah Performing Arts Centre (ManPAC) is a multi-purpose venue situated on the waterfront of Mandjar Bay.

Located within walking distance to surrounding restaurants, public art, boutique shops and accommodation, ManPAC is a great meeting place for business or play.

The venue comprises of two performance theatres, large multi-functional foyers, a dance studio, a meeting room, licensed bar, free parking and an Art Gallery.

ManPAC's professional staff can assist with all your requirements including ticketing, marketing support, merchandise staffing, catering, technical equipment hire and full production services.



Rushton Park

Rushton Park is one of Mandurah's premier sporting facilities and home to Peel Thunder Football Club. With one full size AFL oval (Rushton Main) and two junior size AFL ovals (Rushton North) this complex can accommodate a crowd of up to 10,000 people. Rushton Main also includes some stadium and bench seating, bar facilities and kiosks.

The grounds have hosted a variety of sport and recreation events, however, being fully fenced with a total of 6 hectares across the 3 ovals the grounds are versatile and perfect for any major events such as special interest/hobby events, or music and entertainment events.





Mandurah was originally known as Mandjoogoordap by the Bindjareb people, which means 'meeting place of the heart'. Around this energetic city, waterways meet including the Indian Ocean, the Peel Harvey Estuary, various rivers and the City's urban canals.

Golf

The Peel region boasts six world-class golf courses, all in close proximity. Three are set against the breathtaking Indian Ocean, and the other three are surrounded by forest and wildlife.



Meadow Springs Golf and Country Club

Meadow Springs Golf and Country Club is surrounded by open bushland, towering 200 year old Tuart trees, generous fairways and rolling greens. The first class practice facilities includes a day/night driving range, putting and chipping green, and three practice bunkers.



Mandurah Country Club

Mandurah Country Club was officially established in 1960 and is nestled between the Indian Ocean and the Peel Harvey Estuary offering spectacular views from the clubhouse. With the choice of nine to eighteen holes, this course offers deep bunkers and long fairways between each hole played.



The Cut Golf Course

The Cut Golf Course was voted the number one golf course in 2008/2009 and ranked the country's top 20 public access courses. This golf course is a must visit for all golf enthusiasts and visitors to the Perth and Mandurah areas.

- Get hooked on fishing casting a line from the beach or along the estuary (or join a fishing charter and learn from the experts)
- Spend your days relaxing as you cruise along the waterways in a house boat
- Find your perfect beach from the 50km of coastline

Nature and wildlife

- Spot bottlenose dolphins playing from the shoreline or on a boat cruise
- Go camping at the beautiful Lane Poole Reserve and enjoy all the nature experiences on offer
- Delight in the colourful wildflowers that bloom throughout the region in spring
- Visit the 2,000 year old thrombolite reef at Lake Clifton and see what life was like when the earth began
- Grab your binoculars and go bird watching in the Peel-Yalgorup Wetland System, where thousands of migratory birds visit every year
- Take in the spectacular views of the coast and lakes in Yalgorup National Park
- Watch kangaroos grazing at Melros Reserve in Mandurah, or venture out to Serpentine National Park
- Wander through the forest, along the coast, by a river or over wetlands on one of our many walking trails
- Visit a wildlife park to get up close, hold and feed native animals

- Breathe in the salty air as you speed across the water on a high speed boat cruise or jet-ski tour
- Tee off at one of the region's many golf courses, located along the coast or surrounded by forest
