

FAQ's Cat Local Law 2019

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What is a 'Cat Nuisance'

- An activity or condition which is harmful or annoying
- Affecting the enjoyment of a person on their own property
- Causing damage to another person's property or possessions

What is the consequence of a cat creating a nuisance?

- Where a cat has been deemed to create a nuisance by a Ranger a 'Cat Control Notice' may be issued to the cat owner requiring that person to abate the nuisance
- If the nuisance is not abated in the required time (up to 28 days) a \$200 infringement may be issued

Where are the cat prohibited areas?

- Marlee Reserve, R41392, Lot 806 Mulga Drive, Parklands
- Fairy Tern Sanctuary, R47584 Breakwater Parade, Mandurah
- Dawesville Reserve, R34226, 2-10 Dawesville Road, Dawesville
- Warrungup Spring Reserve, R860 bounded by Jinatong Loop and Estuary Road, (western side of Estuary Rd only),

Can I have more than two cats at my premises?

- A permit is required to keep more than two cats
 - Complete an application form for a permit at the City of Mandurah, 3 Peel St, Mandurah
 - Conditions included on application form and permit

Will my cats have to be confined?

 As a condition of your permit to keep more than two cats they will have to be confined to the premises where registered

What if I already have more than two cats registered?

- Owners of registered cats will automatically receive a permit at no cost.
- To register new cat to your property you will need to be apply for a permit under the above conditions.
